You asked:

I am researching perceptions around Down Syndrome in antenatal care and would like to make a request for examples of communication sent to expectant women. Please can you send me examples of the following:

1. Letters sent to expectant women advising of screening tests following combined/quadruple screen testing for Down Syndrome. I understand the letter may be different depending on whether results are low or high chance so please send examples of each.

Please see attached for the lower chance letter – this is generated by the lab system – the copy isn't of the best quality so please accept our apologies. We contact women who have a higher chance result by phone and back up the discussion with an email – sample attached which is adapted to reflect the discussion.

2. Letters/results from Non-Invasive Prenatal Testing (NIPT), again high and low chance examples if different.

We do not currently offer NIPT but signpost women to ARC to discuss and obtain details of local private providers

3. Examples of information e.g. letters, leaflets, signposting etc. shared with expectant women about these tests (combined/quadruple screening and NIPT).

4. Any information shared with expectant women about Down Syndrome itself (including guidance on pregnancy/care when given an antenatal diagnosis).

The woman would have a discussion with the screening midwife following diagnosis and signposted to the Down syndrome association via the following link: <u>https://www.downs-syndrome.org.uk/</u>

Women are then booked under the care of a named consultant for the remainder of their pregnancy.
