
INFORMATION REQUEST UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

We are now pleased to respond to your request for information under the FOI Act.

You asked:

1. How many data breaches you detected in 2015
2. How many of those breaches were cyber incidents
3. How many data breaches you detected in 2014
4. How many of those breaches in 2014 were cyber incidents

Cyber Incidents were only reported as a separate entry as from 01.04.16. Please see the chart below for a breakdown of incidents.

Questions 5 and 6 - Refusal Notice. The information that you have requested is exempt under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act because it will take more than 18 hours to retrieve and extract the relevant information.

12. — (1) Section 1(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

Regulation 4(3) of the Fees Regulations states that a public authority can only take into account the costs it reasonably expects to incur in carrying out the following permitted activities in complying with the request:

- determining whether the information is held;
- locating the information, or a document containing it;
- retrieving the information, or a document containing it; and
- extracting the information from a document containing it.

All public authorities should calculate the time spent on the permitted activities at the flat rate of £25 per person, per hour.

This means that the appropriate limit will be exceeded if it would require more than 18 hours work for all public authorities.

Regrettably we do not have a single budget line for “cyber security”. As such we do not hold this information in an easily accessible manner.

The only way this information could be compiled is via assessment of each technical solution and each technical resource, referral back to original contracts, on-going support contract, individual payroll and contractor agency payments.

The scale of this work would exceed would exceed 18hrs.

6. *How much your trust spent on cybersecurity in 2014*
