Introduction

Treatment during the COVID-19 pandemic

All our health and care organisations are working to tackle the impact of the COVID-19 virus.

The delivery of services remains a top priority for the NHS.

Due to the increased health and safety risk caused by the COVID-19 virus, some extra steps (precautions) are needed to safeguard patients and staff and ensure the best patient care.

Your Urology consultant recommended that you had surgery. It is important that you follow the advice here to make sure your recovery is as safe and effective as possible.

Aims

Your clinical team will tell you how best to look after yourself when you are discharged home after surgery.

Your clinical team will help with any concerns and answer your questions.

Guidance

Where practicable, follow the 'shielding' guidance below for 14 days following your surgery unless your clinical team advise otherwise.

- If you wish to spend time outdoors (though not in other buildings, households, or enclosed spaces) you should take extra care to minimise contact with others by keeping 2 metres apart.
- If you choose to spend time outdoors, this can be with members of your own household. If you live alone, you can spend time outdoors with one person from another household (ideally the same person each time).
- You should stay alert when leaving home: washing your hands regularly, maintaining social distance and avoiding gatherings of any size.
- You should not attend any gatherings, including gatherings of friends and families in private or public spaces, for example, parties, weddings and religious services.

 You should strictly avoid contact with anyone who is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 (a new continuous cough, a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in sense of taste or smell).

You will receive details of any other aftercare required.
