Chloe's mum and dad ask her what she would like to do.






Mum, Dad and Chloe go back to the hospital.

The doctor explains the sounds Chloe will hear with her cochlear implants will be different to how she heard with her hearing aids.

It may take Chloe a while to get used to hearing the new sounds.



Everyone at the hospital is very friendly. The nurses give her some medicine which makes her go to sleep and not feel anything.





The next morning Chloe has an x-ray to check the electrodes are in the right place and then she's allowed to go home.





It takes a few months of visiting the hospital and getting used to the new sounds her cochlear implants make, but Chloe is very happy.
