Who is your Breast Care Nurse?

Your Breast Care Nurse is a highly qualified and experienced nurse who has specialised in the care and support of patients with breast problems.

- She works closely with the doctor involved in your care.
- The service she provides for you is confidential.

What does the Breast Care Service offer you?

- Information.
- Support and a listening ear.
- Counselling.
- Discussion of treatment options.
- Help with physical problems such as arm swelling or pain.
- Practical advice regarding bras, clothing, and breast forms.
- Information about breast reconstruction.
- Support for carers.

Where can you talk with Breast Care Nurses?

At the outpatient clinic, by appointment only.

The Breast Care Nurse Service is available to all patients who present with a breast problem.

It is an open-ended service which you can continue to use for as long as you need it.
