The supply of surgical footwear

You will be supplied initially with one pair of shoes or boots. These will be reviewed after you have worn them for a time and a second pair may be issued at the discretion of the Podiatrist or Orthotist.

Wearing your new footwear

New footwear should be “worn in” slowly. Start by wearing them for a period of 5 minutes and slowly increase this time each day. After each period of wear check your feet for any signs of rubbing or redness.

If any rubbing does occur don't wear the shoes and contact the department immediately.

Repairs

Whether you are given “bespoke” footwear (that is made-to-measure), or “stock” footwear, they must be brought to the department for repair.

You should bring them in for repair before they wear too far down. Soles should be checked to see if they are getting thin and should not be allowed to wear within an 1/8” (3.175mm) of the upper at the toe.

Heels should be repaired if they are worn by more than ¼” (6.35mm) in any area.

If your shoes wear particularly badly or unevenly, or in any way which adversely affects your walking pattern, please contact the department.

Any shoes that are allowed to wear down at the heel, or through the sole, which puts them into a condition which may be beyond repair, may not be replaced by the department.

Footwear brought in for repair must be in clean condition.

Looking after your footwear

You are responsible for keeping your footwear in good condition. It should be cleaned regularly and the leather should be well polished to repel water and maintain its condition.

If your footwear does get wet, it should never be dried in front of any direct heat source, but should be stuffed with paper and allowed to dry at normal room temperature.

Replacing your footwear

When you feel that your footwear is becoming beyond repair, contact the department for an appointment to review it.

You must bring any footwear supplied by the department to this review, as new footwear can only be issued after we have assessed your
