With reference to your request for information received on 10<sup>th</sup> January 2025, I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold part of the information you have requested. A response to each part of your request is provided below.

In your request you asked:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I am writing to request the following information regarding assessments for potential ADHD and Autistic patients conducted by your hospital between the years 2020 and 2024:

- 1. The total number of ADHD assessments performed during this period.
  - The Trust is unable to provide this information as clinics are all classed as Community Paediatrics, and we are unable to differentiate between the appointment type. Therefore, the Trust is unable to provide this data as it is not recorded centrally, if recorded it would be held within individual case notes. As case notes are for the care and treatment of patients, we do not request staff to interrogate them in order to collate the information required to respond to Freedom of Information requests.
- 2. The number of these assessments that resulted in a successful diagnosis of ADHD.

  The Trust is unable to provide this information as clinics are all classed as Community Paediatrics, and we are unable to differentiate between the appointment type. Therefore, the Trust is unable to provide this data as it is not recorded centrally, if recorded it would be held within individual case notes. As case notes are for the care and treatment of patients, we do not request staff to interrogate them in order to collate the information required to respond to Freedom of Information requests.
- 3. A breakdown of these figures by gender (e.g., male, female, and any other recorded categories). ## 5. The number of these assessments that resulted in a successful diagnosis of Autism.

The Trust is unable to collate the number of positive diagnoses for Autism as this data has not historically been recorded in the system. Therefore, the Trust is unable to provide this data as it is not recorded centrally, if recorded it would be held within individual case notes. As case notes are for the care and treatment of patients, we do not request staff to interrogate them in order to collate the information required to respond to Freedom of Information requests.

6. A breakdown of these figures by gender (e.g., male, female, and any other recorded categories).

2023 = N/A

2024 = 214 Females and 316 Males.
