With reference to your request for information received on 10th February 2025, I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold part of the information you have requested. A response to each part of your request is provided below.

In your request you asked:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please can you provide me with information on A&E waits from decision to admit to admission.

- 1. The number of incidents at your NHS Trust where someone waited 24 hours or longer in A&E from decision to admit to admission in each of the following calendar years:
- A) 2019
- B) 2020
- C) 2021
- D) 2022
- E) 2023
- F) 2024

This information is being withheld under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please see the below.

We are unable to provide this information as the information is not held in a reportable or structured format in our central system and records would have to be reviewed manually which would exceed the appropriate time limit. The Trust has to take into account the cost attributable to the time spent in locating, retrieving, and collating the information. We have therefore applied exemption Section 12 (4) (b) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000-beyond appropriate limit. The appropriate limit is set at £450.00 (18hrs @ £25 per hour). A manual trawl of all records would be required in order to establish whether these patients were waiting over 24 hours as the Trust only validates 12-hour trolley waits currently. If each record took 1 minute to check, this would far surpass the 18 hours limit.

- 2. The number of incidents at your NHS Trust where someone aged 65 or over waited 24 hours or longer in A&E from decision to admit to admission in each of the following calendar years:
- A) 2019
- B) 2020
- C) 2021
- D) 2022
- E) 2023
- F) 2024

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- 3. The longest wait at your NHS in A&E from decision to admit to admission in the year 2024. 122 hours.
- 4. The longest wait at your NHS trust for someone aged 65 or over in A&E from decision to admit to admission in the year 2024.
