With reference to your request for information received on 2nd September 2025, I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold part of the information you have requested. A response to each part of your request is provided below.

In your request you asked:

Under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following information:

- 1. By individual type 1 A&E the number of patients spending more than
 - a. 24 hours from decision to admit to admission (also known as a "trolley wait" breach)

May 2025 = 104.

June 2025 = 92.

July 2025 = 129.

August 2025 = 70.

Total for the four months = 395.

b. Of those, the number of people waiting more than 48 hours

May 2025 = 14.

June 2025 = 3.

July 2025 = 3.

August 2025 = 0.

Total for the four months = 20.

c. Of those, the number of people waiting more than 72 hours

May 2025 = 0.

June 2025 = 1.

July 2025 = 0.

August 2025 = 0.

Total for the four months = 1.

d. Of those, the number of people waiting more than 96 hours

May 2025 = 0. June 2025 = 0. July 2025 = 0. August 2025 = 0. Total for the four months = 0.

e. The longest that any one patient had to wait

May 2025 = 71.1 hours. June 2025 = 75.1 hours. July 2025 = 51.6 hours. August 2025 = 40.2 hours.

2. The number of those patients detailed in (1) for each category (a) - (d) who were classed as mental health patients and the longest that any mental health patient had to wait.

The Trust does not have a way to isolate patients waiting for a mental health bed. Therefore, we are unable to provide this information as the information is not held in a reportable or structured format in our central system and records would have to be reviewed manually which would exceed the appropriate time limit. The Trust has to take into account the cost attributable to the time spent in locating, retrieving, and collating the information. We have therefore applied exemption Section 12 (4) (b) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000-beyond appropriate limit. The appropriate limit is set at £450.00 (18hrs @ £25 per hour).

However, patients presenting at RAEI for mental health conditions are seen by GMMH who may be able to provide the data. Please contact them on foi@gmmh.nhs.uk.

- i. May 2025
- ii. June 2025
- iii. July 2025
- iv. August 2025
- v. The total for the four months

Please note -

- If possible, please give cumulative figures for each time period eg >48 hours also includes >72 and >96
- The point of question 2 is to try to determine whether a patient is waiting for treatment at the acute health trust or local mental health services. I appreciate that some trusts are not able to answer this.
