You asked:

1. Does your trust or health board treat giant cell arteritis (GCA)? If not, please provide the name of the hospital or trust that you refer GCA patients to.

Yes. The rheumatology department of Wrightington, Wigan and Leigh NHS trust based at Wrightington hospital assesses patients for GCA and treats them in accordance with BSR and NICE guidelines.

- 2. In the past 3 months, how many patients with a primary diagnosis of GCA (ICD10 codes M31.5 or M31.6) were:
- a. Admitted as an inpatient
- b. Treated in A&E

- 3. How many patients were treated by the rheumatology department in the past 3 months with the following:
- a. Tocilizumab for any disease = 67.
- b. Tocilizumab for rheumatoid arthritis (RA) only = 29.
- c. Tocilizumab for giant cell arteritis (GCA) only = 0.

Please note that the Trusts Pharmacy system does not store indication data. Therefore, the split of indicator data is only available for homecare data where the indication is recorded. We do not know the indication without consulting patient notes. We do not request staff to interrogate patient notes in order to collate the information required to respond to Freedom of Information requests.

4. How many patients were treated by the ophthalmology department (for any disease) in the past 3 months with Tocilizumab?

5. How many patients were treated in A&E in the past 3 months for giant cell arteritis (GCA) with Tocilizumab?

The Trust has a policy of not releasing information when the data involved is less than 5. This is because we feel that such low numbers could make the individuals involved identifiable and therefore may cause undue harm and distress.
