## Dear Sir/Madam

With reference to your request for information received on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2024, I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold the information you have requested. A response to each part of your request is provided below.

In your request you asked:

1. The total number of patients currently on the waiting list to receive speech and language therapy services.

Please see attached.

2. A breakdown of the waiting list by age groups (0-5 years, 6-10 years, 11-15 years, 16-18 years, 18+ years) for the latest calendar year 2023.

- 3. A breakdown of the number of patients by age group waiting from referral to first appointment:
  - 0-1 weeks (0-7 days)
  - 1-2 weeks (8-14 days)
  - 2-4 weeks (15-28 days)
  - 4-12 weeks (29-84 days)
  - 12-18 weeks (85-126 days)
  - 18-52 weeks (127-364 days)
  - Over 52 weeks (over 365days)

4. Historical data on the waiting list – the total number of patients waiting for speech and language services, a breakdown by age group and weeks waiting for 2019, 2020 and 2021 or the latest year for when records began.

Please note the "Number of Patients waiting for a Speech & Language Therapy Service by Age Groups 11-15, 16-18 and 19+" are being withheld under section 40(2) (personal information) of the Act. This is because releasing the numbers would indicate the actual less than 5 figures in Question 2 and would make individual patients identifiable.

Section 40(2) is an 'absolute' exemption, and the Trust is not obliged to consider whether the public interest favours disclosing the information. Section 40(2) exempts personal information from disclosure if that information relates to someone other than the applicant, and if disclosure of the information would, amongst other things, contravene one of the data protection principles in Article 5 of the UK GDPR. In this case, I believe disclosure would contravene the first data protection principle, which provides that personal data must be processed fairly and lawfully.

If we do not hear from you within 40 days, we will assume that we have been able to accommodate your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.
