HAZEL HENDRIKSEN DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS AND PERFORMANCE FOR SPECIALIST SERVICES DIVISION

What is your role?

I am the Director of Operations and Performance for the Specialist Services Division. I have overall responsibility for the safe and effective delivery of a wide range of specialities including trauma and orthopaedics, rheumatology, dermatology, plastics, out-patients, theatres, cancer care and radiology. I work as part of a Divisional triumvirate which includes myself, the Director of Nursing and AHP's and the Divisional Medical Director.

What is your career journey so far?

I graduated as an Occupational Therapist in 1993 from the University of Liverpool and took up a rotational post to gain a range of experience across acute physical health services. I progressed to a senior role and then moved to work in Wigan to set up the rapid response service. I gained my Masters Degree from Salford University and worked in a clinical and leadership role for many years across the Wigan Borough as the Head Occupational Therapist for Intermediate Care. I then moved into a more multi-disciplinary leadership role and developed and strengthened my leadership skills in an operational manager leading a wide range of community services. I then went on the be the AHP professional lead in a community and mental health trust and developed my skills to become an Assistant Clinical Director. I returned to Wigan and the role of Director of Nursing and AHP in WWL in early 2021 and then subsequently took the post as Director of Operations and Performance.
