- ✓ Supported by our <u>Civic Agreement (wigan.gov.uk)</u>- creating pathways for the community to increase aspiration and knowledge, enabling people to boost their opportunities
- ✓ The importance of health and social care research in finding out **new knowledge** that could lead to changes to health treatments, policies or care and increasing diversity in research.
- ✓ **Research methodology,** design process, asking the research question, timing of funding applications, governance and vast range of funding opportunities available in health and social care on a variety of topics - NIHR's Research Support Service and https://research.northwest.nhs.uk/
- ✓ **Opportunity for wider discussion** breaking down barriers to access to health and care services; building research ready communities; supporting public health behaviour change; actively engage residents in direction and design of research.


