WWL's research strategy

Aim Two - To nurture a culture that embeds research as a core component of high-quality service delivery and develop and sustainable research active workforce.

Aim Three - Develop our core infrastructure to provide effective support to Research Governance, Clinical Delivery and Research Sponsorship.





Public Health Research Principles

- Investigating and addressing health-related issues and concerns at the **population level**.
- Its primary goal is to **improve the health and well-being of communities and societies** by understanding the **factors that influence health**, preventing diseases and injuries, and promoting healthy behaviors and policies.
- Findings are used to inform public health policies, shape healthcare practices, and guide interventions aimed at **improving population health and reducing health inequalities**.
- Critical role in **preventing diseases**, promoting **health equity**, and **enhancing the overall quality of life** for individuals and communities.

Collectively taking **a holistic and wellbeing approach** which contributes to community health and wellbeing building


Focus on research ideas and possibilities which create the conditions for **integration, sickness to prevention, upstream care, hospital to community and analogue to digital**

Building community participation and leadership


- Ensuring those who have the potential to benefit from research are given the opportunity to lead and take part, fostering better outcomes and building skills and opportunities for the longer term.
