Helping speech sounds




Please don't ask your child to repeat words. Drawing too much attention to errors is not helpful

Think about what your child is saying rather than how they are saying it.



Repeat what your child says but give a correct speech model, e.g. if they say 'boon', you could say 'yes, a spoon' Don't pretend to understand, encourage your child to show you what they are talking about



Most children make some speech sound errors when they are young. This is a very normal part of learning to speak. Most children stop using these processes without any specific practice. You can help your child by following these simple top tips.

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
