

Hindley, Scholes & Leigh Dementia Friendly Communities

A Dementia Friendly Community is a city, town or village where people with dementia are understood, respected and supported, and can be confident they can contribute to community life. People will be aware of and understand dementia, and people with dementia will feel included and involved and have choice over their day-to-day lives.

The dementia friendly communities program is part of the Prime Minister's challenge on dementia and projects in Hindley, Scholes & Leigh have looked at what would make a difference for people with dementia and their carers, making their community a good place to live well with dementia.

In order for this to happen the community needed to understand what it means to live with dementia. So the opinions of people with dementia and their carers in Hindley, Scholes & Leigh has been at the heart of any considerations or decisions made by the community.

Around 800,000 people in the UK have dementia and this is predicted to rise to more than a million by 2021. In Wigan Borough it is estimated around 3,200 people have dementia, although it may be more as many people with the condition do not receive a formal diagnosis.

The Dementia Friendly Community initiative has connected a really mixed group of people into a complex social care challenge. Moving away from consultation around services to a "conversation" where people see the solutions resting in their own hands, making the decisions on what a dementia friendly community should look like in their community.

The projects in this flyer are now underway and we have local organisations and businesses leading the work supported by groups of local people. These projects are free to people who have dementia and their carers.
