

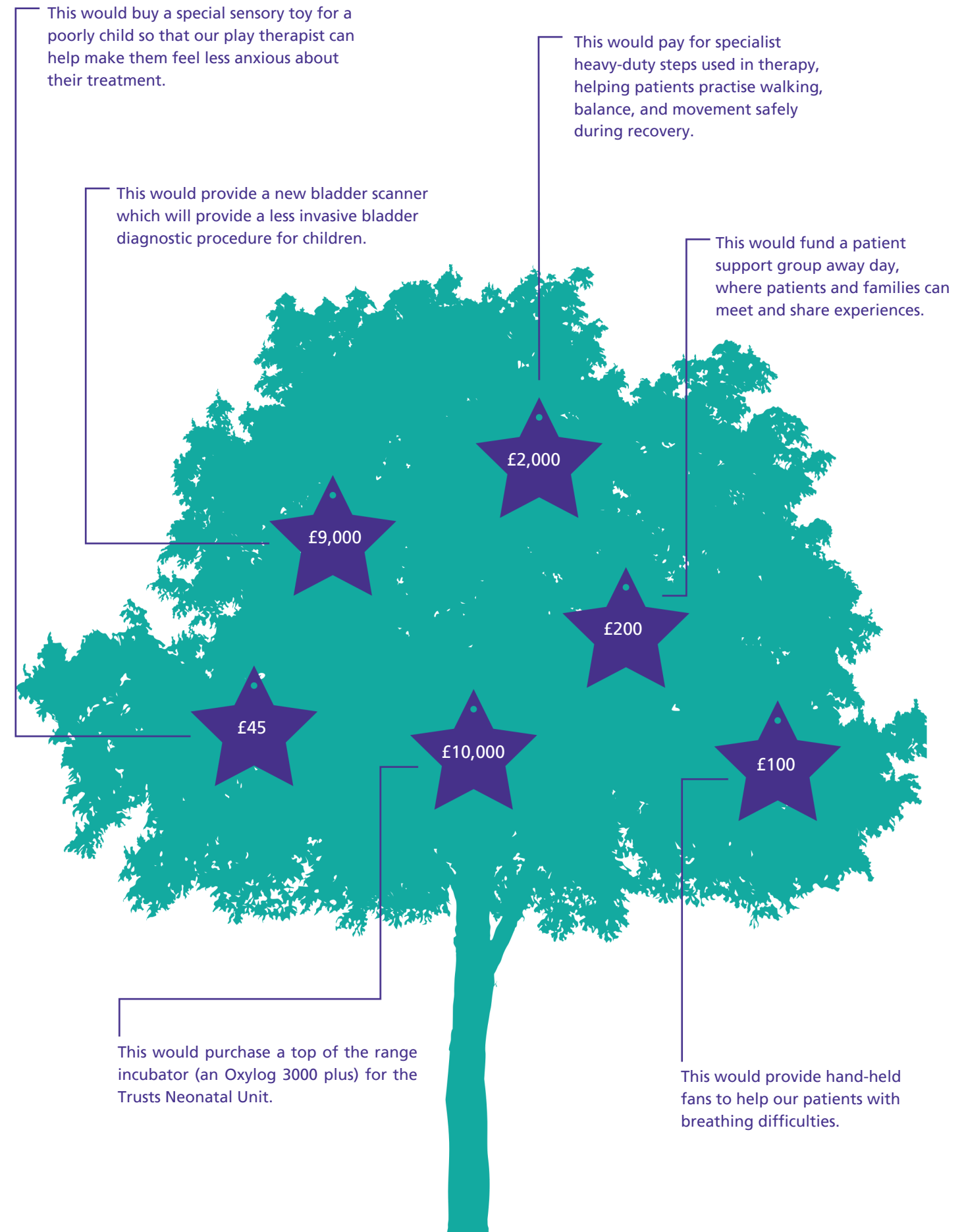


Fundraisers Support Pack

A few tips to help you to start your fundraising

Maybe you've already decided on what you would like to do, so all you need do is contact our team at threewishescharity@wwl.nhs.uk or call 03007078715 and let them know. Don't forget to fill in the fundraising agreement form on page 20 and send it back. If you haven't decided what you like to do, our Charity Manger can offer lots of suggestions from events, runs, walks, treks or social events from fundraising balls to family parties and coffee mornings. If you're holding an event, keep your costs down and ask for a charity rate. If you're doing a sponsored event, we can provide you with the correct sponsorship form which has all the correct information relating to Gift Aid, to help increase your total. Don't forget you'll need to send us the form with your collected donations.

Some of our fabulous fundraisers

Jan's Story

Jan Haydock wanted to do something that would raise money and say a big thank you for the support her granddaughter received as a baby in the Neonatal Unit. She took the brave decision to do her first sky dive and raised a whopping £1257.92, she also got her employer to support her fundraising effort.

Flynn's Story

Born early at 33 weeks, Flynn was cared for in our Neonatal Unit and Rainbow Ward. To say thank you, he bravely abseiled down Anfield Stadium, raising over £1,000 in just two days for our Children and Babies Fund! Flynn told us:

"It was the best thing ever abseiling down even though I was nervous and everyone looked so tiny, but I would do it again to get even more things for the babies and children."

Chris's Story

"For the last 10 years I have organised a Charity Concert specifically aimed at raising money for Mr Harland's Breast Cancer Service, here at Wigan Infirmary following my own brush with the disease in 2003. So far we have raised not far short of £25,000, of which I am immensely proud, as you can imagine."

In your community

Why not set up a fundraising group in your community to raise funds for a particular cause or buy equipment for a ward? Our Charity Office has buckets, collection boxes, home collection boxes and lots of other fundraising materials you could use.

At work

Employee fundraising is a great way to build staff morale and team spirit. It can also generate goodwill with your customers, suppliers and the local community. Why not ask workmates to give up a vice such as smoking, or even go without chocolate for sponsorship from colleagues. Why not hold a cake/bake sale or "dress down" day!

In schools

Experience shows that children get real sense of achievement helping other children less fortunate than themselves, perhaps your school or class would be inspired by raising money for specialist play equipment on our Rainbow Ward?

Got all the gifts you need? Then why not ask friends and families to help make your wishes come true by asking for donations at your wedding, special birthday, christening or anniversary instead of gifts, flowers and cards? Mel and Sue kindly included us in their 40th Wedding Anniversary and raised an incredible £1,890 for our Cancer Care Fund.



In memory and in tribute

At this sad time, many families ask their friends to make a donation in memory of their loved one, rather than sending flowers to a funeral. This commemorates their life, with donations dedicated to helping patients in similar circumstances. Many funeral directors will offer to handle the administration of donations for you, and we're happy to deal directly with them and answer any questions they may have on your behalf.



Keeping you safe and keeping it legal!

We are very pleased that you've decided to fundraise for us and your safety is paramount to us so please follow our guidelines when organising and holding any event.

1. All publicity materials should state in aid of Three Wishes Hospital Charity, registered charity no 1048659. We can also supply you the correct logo for you to use. We can also give you a formal letter to prove that you are fundraising legitimately on our behalf.
2. If you are holding an event make sure the venue's public liability covers you in the event of a claim, or consider whether you will need your own insurance cover.
3. Collections in the street will require a permit from the local council, collections on private property are at the discretion of the owner/landlord.
4. There are laws relating to raffles and lotteries but you do NOT need a licence provided you sell and draw your raffle on the same day, the prizes are not monetary or worth more than £250.
5. Always try to make sure that there are two people to count and handle money. Consider using a venues safe to keep large amounts if your event is at night.
6. Try to make sure that you get permission from the subject if you plan to use a photo, you will certainly need permission from parents before taking photos of children.
7. Liability, please note that Wroughtington, Wigan and Leigh NHS Charity cannot accept any responsibility for your event, nor for anyone who participates in it.
8. All funds collected for the Charity should be sent as soon as possible to the charity. Cash can also be paid into our General Office by arrangement with our Charity Manager on 03007078715.
